

Sarah Wallace OBE FRCSLT is a Consultant Speech and Language Therapist (SLT) at Wythenshawe Hospital in Manchester, UK, an Honorary Senior Lecturer at the University of Manchester, SLT lead for the National Tracheostomy Safety Project, an RCSLT Specialist Advisor and on the Editorial board of the Journal of the

Intensive Care Society. She specialises in Critical Care and Dysphagia and has over 30 years clinical experience. She trained in Manchester and has worked in the UK, Singapore, Grenada (WI) and Cambodia, in both hospitals and community and for Non-Government Organisations. She set up the first FEES services in Singapore and the UK 25 years ago. She holds expert lead roles with the Intensive Care Society (ICS), and the Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists (RCSLT), NHS-Elect, British Thoracic Society and the National Confidential Enquiry into Patient Outcome and Death. She is on the committees of the UK Swallowing Research Group and the RCSLT Tracheostomy and FEES/VFS Clinical Excellence Networks. Sarah has contributed to numerous national policies and guidelines on critical care, dysphagia, tracheostomy and Covid-19. She teaches internationally and has published her research into laryngeal injury and rehabilitation in intensive care widely, gaining an AJSLP Editors award, top cited articles and national awards from the British Medical Journal (BMJ) and the ICS. Her collaborative tracheostomy quality improvement project has been adopted by NHS England and internationally. Sarah has pioneered new treatments, supported service development, and provided training in the UK and internationally, most recently Germany and Chile. She played a key clinical and strategic role in the pandemic response for SLT as the single point of contact for ICU for the RCSLT and ICS. She was awarded an OBE in the Queens New Year's Honours list 2020/2021, a Fellowship by the RCSLT and an honorary Masters degree for her contributions to the NHS and the SLT profession.
